Increase mental and emotional wellness for local residents through greater access to high-quality arts experiences



Follow through on Starlight's responsibility to embed Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Accessibility in all areas of the organization



Solicit direct feedback from individuals who live and/or work in the immediate areas surrounding Starlight

DIVERSITY

Starlight values the unique differences of our employees and community and the ways in which those differences contribute to a richer, more creative, and productive work culture and experience.

EQUITY

Starlight promotes fairness within policies, procedures, resources, programs, and opportunities, which create conditions that allow all to reach their full potential.

ACCESS

Starlight provides fair and equitable access to services, resources, and opportunities that are essential to achieve and maintain social, cultural, and economic well-being.

Brainstormed key questions for the community



Developed a list of organizations to build relationships with, including:


- Neighborhood Associations

Survey completion was incentivized through a drawing to receive 1 of 5 \$50 Visa gift cards




Surveys were created in both paper and online formats



Relationship to the Swope Park Area (142 Responses)




- I live in the Swope Park










Which aspects of the Swope Park area are in greatest need of improvement?


"Other" responses included: High-quality mental health services, signage, more programming for all cultures, money for schools, and multimodal transportation like bike lanes and sidewalks.

How recently, if ever, have you been to Starlight Theatre for a performance or other type of event?




How do you typically hear about Starlight programming?


What Barriers Have You Experienced to Starlight Event Attendance?

What They Like...

Are there things you like about having Starlight in the Swope Park area?

"It offers the arts in the area where marginalized live."

"Brings culture and diversity to the neighborhood."

"Convenient and beautiful location."

"Easy access and great location within the park. **Love having the sound of concerts** that I can hear even though I'm not in attendance."

"Love the history of the theater...grew up down the street. I would go as a child and they would let you attend for free in the back rows!"

"It's very central to the city. It's easy to get to. I love the open air venue, **it's unique and special**."

"Brings employment opportunities into the area."

"There's a variety of people in this area and **Starlight is a great unifier for all different types** of people - as long as it's accessible."

What They Dislike...

Are there things you dislike about having Starlight in the Swope Park area?

"Safety is a big concern."

"The traffic."

"Limited **park access** on show nights."

"Parking is difficult."

"There are no **weekend matinee performances** for people that don't get out after dark."

"After the shows end, **walking to your car is very dark**, maybe improve the lighting surrounding the parking areas."

"There is **nothing I dislike** about having the Starlight in the Swope Park area."

Ideas for Future Programming

What types of events would you like to see at Starlight?

"Concerts, Broadways, Movie Nights."

"More diverse Broadway shows. Free concerts in the park."

"Community led theatre productions that are inclusive to ALL youth in our area."

"More cultural performances."

"I know there are currently commercials but I'd like something I could maybe put on my fridge as a reminder there are events happening."

"I love all the shows at Starlight and performed in Annie, Annie Get Your Gun, Hair, Peter Pan etc. in the 80s ! The stage was the place to leave it ALL behind and I now have a talented grandson who loves the arts...**it's just a challenge to afford the shows consistently.** "
